Pink Shirt day was well supported, see the great photos further on. Since it was a focus on *anti-bullying* we took the opportunity to highlight our school values Ngā Uara in assembly.

Manaakitanga—I am kind, caring, respectful

Māramatanga—I am understanding, curious, creative

Whanaungatanga—I am fair, a true friend, proud of my culture

Mana tangata-I am self aware, confident, maintain my well being

Ngā Uara /Values are acknowledged in every class. Each whanau has ways of awarding/ or recognising individuals and groups of children, demonstrating Ngā Uara We aspire to take every opportunity to foreground these Ngā Uara.

Children also volunteered to come to the front of the assembly and tell us their views on *bullying* and what everyone can do to address it. Suggestions: included Stop, Walkaway, Ignore, Go get help and more. The senior/ tuakana children were reminded they could help the juniors sort out differences; likewise the juniors may ask a senior child to come and help.

In highlighting our values/ Ngā Uara and saying what these mean in practice; it is equally important to say what it is not; which is *bullying* behavior.

Staff would appreciate it if each whanau discusses the policy with their child, making it understandable for them.

Bullying

Bullying is a form of <u>harassment</u>, and usually refers to intimidatory behavior between school students, but may involve staff. If the bullying involves staff and students, the <u>harassment complaints procedure</u> is followed.

Bullying is deliberate, harmful behavior that is repeated, or continues over a period of time. It often involves a power imbalance and it is difficult for those being bullied to defend themselves.

All members of the school have a responsibility to recognise bullying and to take action when they are aware of it happening. Bullying behavior can be overt (directly and easily observed) or covert (indirect, hidden, or less easily observed). A great deal of bullying is covert with bullying behavior rarely occurring in front of adults. If students are being bullied, they need to feel supported and know what to do.

Examples of bullying behaviours include:

- physical, e.g. hitting, kicking, taking belongings
- verbal, e.g. name calling, insults
- social/relational, e.g. spreading nasty stories, excluding from groups, making threats
- identity-based bullying, e.g. racist, sexist, religious, ablest, sexuality and gender-based bullying.

To effectively prevent and respond to bullying behavior at Clyde Quay School we:

- create a <u>safe</u>, <u>inclusive</u>, and respectful environment
- recognise diversity and avoid cultural bias
- work to eliminate racism, discrimination, and stigma in education
- Promote <u>digital citizenship</u> and cybersafety to our students
- identify and acknowledge bullying behavior and do not tolerate it
- deal with incidents of bullying through the school's Behaviour Management plan.
