We are a year 13 Business group at Wellington College participating in the Young Enterprise Challenge which is partnered with the Lions Foundation. YES describes itself as "an opportunity for students to unleash their inner entrepreneur ... and run a real business. Each YES company creates their own product or service and brings this to market". For our business, we have developed a new product for the market with the post-pandemic world in mind. It is a lightbulb that combines LEDs with ultraviolet bulbs (Far UVC). The LEDs can be used for conventional lighting, while the UV bulbs emit ultraviolet rays which can kill harmful bacteria and germs. LEDs are environmentally friendly and can help you save hundreds of dollars a year when compared with traditional lighting options. The lightbulb will use smart technology so that when you are not home, with a few clicks on your phone, you can turn on the UV feature which will begin killing bacteria. If any motion is detected, the UV feature will immediately turn off and revert to standard LEDs.

We plan on utilizing Far UVC technology for our product. Far UVC efficiently and safely eliminates viruses and has been proven to be safe for humans. Which would negate the health risks associated with other ultraviolet technologies.
